10th. Elder Charles B. Smith to write the Circular Letter

for next year.

11th. The Association to meet next year, at the Court-House in Hillsborough, Highland County, on Friday before the fourth

Lord's day in August.

12th. Two yearly meetings appointed: one at brother John Ritches, on Brush-Creek, on Saturday before the third Lord's day in November ensuing—Elders Smith and Hutchings to attend. Circular Letter.

BELOVED BRETHREN,
